Lenten Theme: Dead to Sin; Alive in Christ!

How has your Lent been going? As we come close to the end of Lent, you may find yourself thinking either "I haven't really been faithful to a Lenten discipline or to every day prayer." In effect, "I haven't done much of anything to know Jesus better and make God the center of my life!"

I'd like to suggest that you in these final weeks of Lent and during Holy Week, pray the "Jesus Prayer." It is biblically based and can be said anywhere at any time of the day. Begin by saying,"Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God" inhaling and exhaling out the words "have mercy on me a sinner." I have learned that it is helpful to take an extended time of silence in the day or night to pray the Jesus Prayer dozens of times, slowly inhaling and exhaling the words. You'll discover that by continuously inhaling and exhaling the Jesus Prayer, it soon will become as natural as breathing. You'll find too that it will become a way of practicing God's presence and experiencing the peace and love of Christ throughout the day and night. Why not give it a try? it just might be something you'll want to add to your spiritual practices in these last 3 weeks of Lent. Both men and women have found this practice meaningful and helpful.

Lastly, the ropes in the church have been removed. You can sit anywhere you like and on Easter Sunday we will fully open with coffee and donuts following the Eucharist. Please come back home as this will also be "Homecoming Sunday." Bring a friend or relative.

There can't be an Easter without Holy Week. Come and experience these sacred events by participating in the Last Supper on Maundy Thursday and walk with Jesus to Golgotha on Good Friday. These liturgies are at 6:30 pm and will be as participatory as possible. If you haven't been to Holy Week Services in a long time, why not come this year? It will make your Easter so much more complete and fulfilling.

Have a Holy and Blessed Easter as we move forward together beyond COVID! My wish for you is for inner peace free of anxiety this Eastertide. Thank you for everything you do for our beloved Holy Trinity. Stay well, be good of heart and let go, let God!

Holy Trinity as a parish is entering a phase in our experience together that many of us have not had in the past, finding a new priest for our parish. This can be daunting, exhilarating, exhausting, and joyous, often at the same time.

In February, Karen Olson, ECMN Canon for Ministry, joined the Vestry one evening to share the process and organization necessary for the "search" for a new priest. What follows here are the first two steps in her recommended organization. Each month I will share more steps.

The first step is to acknowledge the range of emotions present for the current clergy. These are many and varied, often changing at a moment's notice. After meeting with Canon Olson, we make arrangements to call a "transition" priest to provide necessary services for the congregation until a new priest is found.

The second step is to specify the current state of the congregation and its finances. This will lead to determining a "ministry model," for example, a full-time rector, a part-time rector, etc. Finance plays a large part in this step and it is not just looking at the bottom line on a spreadsheet.

The Vestry is ready to ask for a transitional priest to assist us once Father Rob resigns/retires from his role with us on June 5, 2022. Believe me when I say that none of these steps will happen quickly, or even when WE want them to. There is a great deal of thought and prayer that is involved in all of these steps.

I ask all of you to do a little internal investigation at this point. Are you able and willing to be patient, trusting, objective, focused, and respectful of other's opinions? Are you able to spend many hours over many weeks considering alternatives? If so, you might make a good transition committee member. I am not asking for names right now, just planting a seed for you to think about.

I will keep all of you up to date on what's happening as the days and weeks go by.

WHY DO WE KNEEL DURING THE SEASON OF LENT?

Kneeling during parts of the liturgy during Lent is in stark contrast to what we have been doing since Easter which has been standing for most of the service including even The Confession. Standing signifies that we a Resurrection people and we had just gone through the season of Lent and Holy Week. During Lent, we will be kneeling more than usual because:

- + Kneeling denotes reverence and humility.
- + Lent is a time of introspection and reflection.
- † It is common across the Episcopal Church to kneel during the season of Lent.
- † Kneeling is optional and if you prefer to sit you may do so.
- † Kneeling is prayerful as many kneel in prayer on first coming into church.

Kneeling is part of who we are as Episcopalians – Sit to learn and listen, stand to sing and praise and kneel to pray especially for penitential prayer.
