Lent begins on March 2, 2022 with Imposition of Ashes and Holy Eucharist. Lent is sometimes referred to as a pilgrimage or a journey. Very few people set out on any kind of journey without packing a bag. The invitation to the observance of a Holy Lent in the Book of Common Prayer provides a packing list. The list may not be exhaustive but it is a good start.

Self examination and repentance prayer fasting self denial reading and meditating on God's holy word.

Lenten Meditations on our website from Episcopal Relief and Development.

- **The meditation booklet,** <u>The Cup of Salvation</u>, which will be placed in your mailbox. It's a series of daily meditations, prayers and personal stories of growth that will illustrate how God speaks to people through a variety of life experiences. Pick it up on Sunday or any Wednesday, 10 am to 4 pm.
- <u>The Forward Day by Day Meditation</u> is now online at prayer.forwardmovement.org. There may be some hard copies available in the Moyer Parish Hall.
- **Ash Wednesday Liturgy with Ashes and Communion**—6:30 pm. Good way to start your Lent!
- **Noonday Prayer** held every Wednesday at 11:30 am with Holy Eucharist at 11:30 am on Wednesday, April 6, 2022.
- **Lenten Sunday Worship** every Sunday in Lent—March 6, 13, 20, 27 and April 3, 2022.
- **Lenten Spiritual Practices**—Go to episcopalmn.org and click on Resources for details.



(I forgot to send around a sign-up sheet.) After the Women's Group meets hopefully at the beginning of March, we can ask them for their on-going assistance.

On Wednesday, February 23, the Vestry and Wardens will meet with Karen Olsen from ECMN to discuss the procedures we need to follow in finding a new Priest. There will be continuing information provided as we continue on this path. I said at the Annual Meeting that Father Rob really can not be replaced, and I meant that, so all of us now need to think differently about the future. ### TREASURER'S REPORT

#### MARY BRUGGER

Since this is being written the day following the Annual Meeting where I was elected, the report will be short and not overly full of data. Thank you for trusting me with the oversight and reporting of the Parish finances.

First, I will promise that there will be something from the Treasurer in each monthly newsletter. We are beginning a crossroad year for Holy Trinity. As many of you know, while the Parish is cash solvent and not in danger of bankruptcy, the operating budget for 2022 was approved with a forecast \$20k loss. I will be working with the Vestry to determine how to improve that situation and what steps we should take to move in a positive direction.

During 2022, you will hear the word "sustainable" or some derivative of it from me a lot. We need to develop a thoughtful approach that will lead this Parish to long-term sustainability. My goal for the next month is to work with our outgoing Treasurer to ensure a stable and complete transition.



#### **NOTES FROM THE VESTRY**

Notes from the Vestry

January and February have been busy months for your Vestry. As always, we keep a sharp watch on the rising and now falling numbers of COVID cases in the counties in which our parishioners live. At this time numbers are getting ever closer to a "safe" range in which we can soon enjoy fellowship after Sunday service and regular meetings and activities can resume.

For those of you able to attend in person or via Zoom, we held our annual All Parish Meeting on Sunday, February 20th. We learned that we had erroneously called last years meeting the 165th when it should have been the 164th! Those attending in person were delighted to find the tables back up in the Parish Hall and coffee being served!

Fr. Rob called the 165th All Parish meeting to order with a reading from Ecclesiastics. He reviewed events of the past year, thanked outgoing Vestry members for their service and named new members who joined our faith community during the past year. He reminded us of the Baptisms and confirmations we witnessed. He also reminded us of the loss of treasured parishioners, Debbie Krogman and Richard Gardner.

The choice of Fr. Rob's opening reading: "For everything is a season and a time for every purpose under heaven" struck a poignant note with all of us as he talked about his plans to leave Holy Trinity in June. Canon Karen Olson, from ECMN will assist us with this transition. Although I have only experienced half of Fr. Rob's tenure here, I know that during his ten years here, we have enjoyed strong spiritual leadership, stimulating and challenging sermons and outreach and support far beyond the part-time work he was contracted to do. I have also experienced Holy Trinity as a strong, resilient, and loving faith community that will rise to the challenge of this painful and sad transition.

For the remainder of the meeting, reports were presented (you have copies of these reports in the packet you received in the mail). The Nominating Committee presented a slate of new Vestry members which were approved by those members present. Your new Vestry members returning: Daryl Herrmann, Senior Warden; Gary Wedl, Junior Warden; members Wesley Gadsden, Dave Raitz and Gail Weber. New members are Lyla Aaland, Emily Schroeder, Laurie Peck-Secretary/Clerk and Mary Brugger, Treasurer. The 2022 ECMN Convention delegates and West Metro Mission Area representatives are Joyce LeClaire, delegate, Mary Brugger, delegate, Daryl Herrmann, alternate.

Outgoing treasurer, Jeff Nagorski presented the 2021 financial statements and the 2022 budget. He expressed concern over ending 2021 with a deficit and said our ongoing financial support is key to dealing with this during the coming year. He thanked

us for our pledges and continuing financial support. The 2022 budget as presented contains no changes from the 2021 budget. Both the 2021 financial statements and the 2022 budget were approved.

Fr. Rob closed the meeting with a prayer. Folks lingered, obviously delighted to chat over coffee and pitch in to clean up the kitchen and hall. We left with a feeling of hope that this long dark winter of COVID is nearing its end.

Kneeling during parts of the liturgy during Lent is in stark contrast to what we have been doing since Easter which has been standing for most of the service including even The Confession. Standing signifies that we a Resurrection people and we had just gone through the season of Lent and Holy Week. During Lent, we will be kneeling more than usual because:

- Kneeling denotes reverence and humility.
- + Lent is a time of introspection and reflection.
- † It is common across the Episcopal Church to kneel during the season of Lent.

- † Kneeling is optional and if you prefer to sit you may do so.
- t Kneeling is prayerful as many kneel in prayer on first coming into church.
