HAPPY EASTERTIDE!

How was your Easter celebration? We had a glorious celebration of Jesus' Resurrection on Easter Sunday with everything back to normal. We missed many of you as we did during Holy Week. Hope is Easter's focus – hope that there is life after death, hope that things will change for the better in our lives and hope for the future of our families as well as hope for our faith community's continued growth in Jesus' love. **YOU are Holy Trinity! You are what makes us vibrant and alive with God's love and sharing that love with each person who enters our doors.** That's why we need you here to be part of the Body of Christ in Elk River and all the cities and region that we serve. **It's time for unity of purpose and helping one another in our faith journey as well as building up the Body of Christ in Holy Trinity.**

We need to hold onto that hope that God intends to create a new heaven and a new earth and that Jesus' bodily resurrection is the sure and certain sign of promise that changes everything. If God can really raise Jesus in a new and glorified body and if God intends the same for us there isn't anything that isn't possible through God's love and power.

Let's celebrate the 50 days of Easter together every Sunday in community and bonds of love with one another. I'd also suggest another practice of cultivating hope in the resurrection in our daily lives this Eastertide.

This practice can cultivate the hope of the resurrection in the here-andnow. Add a word to your daily vocabulary, a resurrection word: "Hallelujah." You may remember the Academy Award-winning film, "Babette's Feast," which is set on the remote western coast of Denmark in the 19th century. One of the characters in the film is an elderly man who has seemingly lost his ability to speak... except for one word: "Hallelujah." And he says "Hallelujah" all the time. Whether the conversation is about fish, or the weather, or a friendship, or a feast, his one-word response to life is always, "Hallelujah." It's actually a very good word: "Hallelujah." If you have no other response to the unfolding of life, if you have nothing else to say, or, especially, if you have nothing good to say, say "Hallelujah." During Eastertide, when we gather to pray and worship on Sunday, we say "Hallelujah" is also a very good word to take with you out of church, to say personally as you make your way through the day.

"Hallelujah" is a Hebrew word that means "praise the Lord." The word does not appear in the Gospel according to Matthew, nor Mark, nor Luke, nor John. The word "Hallelujah" does not appear anywhere in the New Testament except in the last book in one chapter of the Revelation to John. There we read about "Hallelujah" as the chant of the choirs of heaven singing praise, and glory, and gratitude to God who is the beginning of life, and the end of life and the way of life. **Saying "Hallelujah" lifts you and me into a heavenly chorus!**


Claiming the word "Hallelujah" in our personal vocabulary is an elixir from the delusion that we are our own God. Claiming the word "Hallelujah"

spares us from thinking it is all up to us, spares us from taking life for granted, spares us from the myopia of seeing life as only an earthbound experience. Life on **this earth is real, indeed, but it's also a preparation and participation in the life that is to come.** By saying "Hallelujah" we put ourselves in our place: creatures of God, participating in God's mission on earth: God's kingdom come, God's will be done, on earth as it is in heaven." **Saying "Hallelujah" expresses our personal gratitude for the gift of life and to giver of life.**

You might find it inviting to say "Hallelujah" under your breath throughout the day as you take on life. Amidst *so* much suffering that fills and surrounds our lives, there is also the panoply of such beauty and wonder and in *so* many forms. Saying "Hallelujah" under your breath a myriad of times throughout the day is claiming your voice and claiming your part in what God is up to in sharing with us this mysterious, absolutely amazing, challenging gift of life. **Saying "Hallelujah" expresses obeisance to God as we seek to find our way and help others find their way in life, back to where we began, and where we belong, and where we will end: in the company of God. Saying "Hallelujah" heralds the hope of Easter!!**

Have a stunning month of hope and happiness! This will be my last full month with you. Please pray for me and one another. Pray also for hope not only for your own personal journey to the Kingdom but also for Holy Trinity's journey in discernment and ongoing witness to Christ's love for one another and the region we serve.

As we progress through the steps outlined for us by ECMN in our transition to a new priest, we reach the point where we look at the reality of Holy Trinity and prepare to organize a transition/search team.

On Sunday (April 24), I "assigned" all in attendance at Holy Trinity some homework, to think of one word that describes what you think is most important about Holy Trinity. (If you were on Facebook last Sunday, or just not present, you can still do this, but asap, please.) On Sunday, May 1, you will have a brief time to write down your choice on a piece of paper, no names please. These "words on paper" will be collected and compiled for the eventual Search Committee as a starting point for a description of our parish.

In last month's Newsletter, I asked all of you to do some thinking and introspection about your ability and readiness to participate on the Search Committee. I know some of you immediately dismissed the idea for a variety of reasons. Not a problem. If you are even considering the possibility in the slightest, here are some additional points to think about.

We are looking for FIVE people of diverse ages and backgrounds. If 8 men all in their 60s volunteer, that won't be the Search Committee. Vestry members are not eligible to be on the Search Committee.

I have no idea how much time the Committee will need. The schedule will be devised by the Committee and ECMN representatives. Let me assure you, the Search will not be completed in the next six weeks.

What is Holy Trinity's relationship to the community as a whole? (Remember, parishioners come from a variety of locations in our area.) What should that relationship be? This is an important element of the parish description (profile) that is the first undertaking of the committee. This is the information candidates for the position will see.

As you can see, there is a lot to be considered in the near future. In the immediate future, we need to continue to "say our good byes" to Father Rob for his ten-year tenure with us. Until this is done, we cannot move on.
