TREASURER MARY BRUGGER

Jottings from your Treasurer

At this point in the year, with 1/3 of the year in the books, I am happy to report that we are presently in a positive position. Before everyone gets too excited and looks for ways to spend money, please understand that we are sticking to our established budget for the first six months before reforecasting 2022. We do not yet know the full impact of Father Rob's departure or the ongoing costs for ministry which we will incur.

What I can tell you is that Pledges overall are over budget to date. Four of our 25 annual pledges are paid in full. No pledges are significantly under budget. We are planning to send out a pledge report during July which will cover the first six months of 2022. The cash we collect on Sundays (Open Plate) is ahead of budgeted amount. At this point, non-pledge revenues are \$1500 ahead of budget. This is much more difficult to plan and forecast.

On the expense side, Clergy expenses over budget due to supply clergy in March. Budget was \$500 for year, \$661 spend to date. We will be reforecasting this area in June. Other expense items of note: PayPal fees to date are \$203, copier expense is running \$2200 ahead of budget and postage is 10% over budget. We are working as a Vestry to make sure expenditures remain within budgeted amounts.

Bottom line for the first 4 months is that we are showing a small positive balance when Income is Compared to Expenses. We were forecast to show a negative amount. Please keep up your support as we enter the summer months. During June, we will be adding a few financial lines toward the end of our bulletin periodically. We will be taking the model from some other Parishes as part of an increased communication strategy.

PRAYER SHAWL MINISTRY AT HOLY TRINITY

Fifteen shawls and Afghans were completed to date in 2022. Since our March report, 3 Prayer Shawls/Lap Robes have been distributed within our community. A baptismal Afghan and crocheted animal were provided for the Copeland Baptism. As we write this, two more sets are being prepared for the May 29th Baptisms.

We have joined forces with Father Joe Calandra and his team at Guardian Angels during the last few weeks. A chance discussion at the GA Gala led to our team providing the first 10 prayer shawls and Afghans for use in his ministry.

The group meets every Thursday afternoon in the Parish Hall to work on projects, prepare our Bulletins and often newsletters and other mailings. There is someone at church by 1:30 and we will be there until 3 or later. Please join us if you wish to do so. If you wish to provide shawls or Afghans and are unable to join us in person, we will still welcome you. One of our most prolific members is the sister of a parishioner who has sent us 6 wonderful shawls so far this year.

If you aren't sure of your crochet or knitting abilities, but would like to learn, we would be glad to assist. We also have yarn, crochet hooks, knitting needles, and patterns to get you started. If you prefer to bring another craft or to just come for the company, please join us. It is an opportunity for fellowship within our community.

West Metro Mission Area Gathering April 30. 2022

Report from the Holy Trinity Delegates, Joyce LeClaire and Mary Brugger

The West Metro Mission Area group met with the Central Metro Mission area representatives on Saturday, April 30th in the gathering space of the ECMN headquarters building on West Broadway in Minneapolis. Your delegates were joined by Father Rob and others from around the two Mission Areas.

Father Phil Boelter (Trinity, Anoka) opened the meeting by leading the group in the practice of Dwelling in Scripture using Revelations 22:1-5. The images of leaves on the tree healing nations and the river of God flowing through the city worked through our minds in small and large group discussions.

Bishop Loya offered a short reflection, starting with his recent reading of work by Suzanne Simard, a Forestry Scientist in British Columbia. Her work is fictionalized in the book, <u>The Overstory</u> where she appears as a fictional character. The Bishop likened our diocese to a system of trees connected through a vast root system, building a microcosmic network connecting all of us. Bishop Loya spoke of building and increasing networks within the diocese which will allow us to share and support each other. He sees our future as one of mutual interdependence and loving care.

The group then paired off with someone you did not know to Share Spiritual Stories, reflecting on a time when we grew spiritually in a significant way. Mary partnered with a woman she had never personally met. Our discussion led us to discover similar points along our faith journeys.

After a short break, the Rev. Canon Blair Pogue, the newly named Canon for Vitality and Innovation, led a set of presentations on Faithful Innovation: What, Where, Who, How. A set of processes based on an Oxford Innovation Hub are being introduced in the Diocese, starting with the Southeast Minnesota Mission Area. Metro area churches will be asked to join the process later, most likely around September.

The new process is a way to connect God's presence, reality, and activity with the communities we serve. She offered that we are undertaking this because many of the challenges facing our faith communities have no easy answers and require new learning. Each parish-based team will consist of 3-8 people, all lay leaders. They will do the work. Clergy are there to keep the group connected to God. The teams will work 3 months on **listening** to God, to one another, to their church neighbors. The next three months, the same teams will focus on **acting**, coming up with several small experiments or experiences to try for the time period. One participant simply put some lawn chairs on his front lawn and sat there for a period of time each day. He got to know his neighbors in a new way. The last three months are spent reflecting, **sharing**, and determining what this would mean if adopted by the broader parish or a group of parishes. Each team will have a trained mentor/coach from outside of their Parish and all teams from a Mission Area will meet in a common space at the start of the process and at each quarterly checkpoint.

The process is designed to fill people spiritually and promote spiritual growth. The goal is to build relationships of trust using listening practices and to help Parish members connect to areas where they are already rooted.

The meeting concluded with small group discussions, sharing innovations developed during COVID and Parish learnings with those at our table. We also worked on the question of what keeps the people in our faith community up at night and what keeps our neighbors up at night. Our next meeting will be closer to the fall convention and most likely will include a preview of the business and budgets to be offered at the convention.






