Search Team Update

As of Friday, August 19th, Holy Cow reported they had received 54 completed surveys from Holy Trinity parishioners. The deadline was August22nd, and we will be getting a final number on Friday, August 26th.

This was the easy part of the search for a new priest! On Sunday, September 18th, Canon Karen Olson will be at Holy Trinity to lead us in Morning Prayer, as well as preach. Immediately afterwards, during fellowship, she will present the findings from the surveys. Holy Cow does a lengthy data analysis and Canon Olson is a trained interpreter/presenter of these analyses.

This will help us determine needs of the community within and around Holy Trinity and identify clergy gifts needed to match those needs. We need to prepare search materials which includes a written profile of our parish including our strengths and challenges. Interested candidates will be looking at our web How does it represent us? Does it need updating? We need to prepare for the interviews. How will we conduct a mutual discernment process? What questions to What experience is imask? portant? It's unlikely a candidate can meet all our needs, so what is most important to us?

Traditionally, candidates indicate their interest to the Bishop and Canon for Ministry who make initial reference checks and then send candidate names to the Search Team. After a mutual discernment process that includes reviewing information from the candidates, and conducting interviews, the Search Team selects a candidate to recommend to the Vestry. The Vestry affirms, the Wardens issue the call, and a letter of agreement is finalized after which the announcement is made.

As Canon Olson guides us through this process, we hope to modify it in ways that is more inclusive and transparent to the congregation. Please come to the presentation on September 18th with your questions and recommendations. Your Search Team will be hearing this information for the first time with you! Our goal is to find the best match for the whole parish.

LITURGY/WORSHIP

Fellow Trinitarians:

Summer is winding down and before we know it it's going to be The Great Fall Get-Together on September 11.. It's the Sunday that signals a more routine, back-to-school, less time at the cabin time of the year. Some look forward to it; some dread it. It has been an unusual summer. Since Father Rob left, we have worshiped with Rev. James Wilson II and Rev. Elaine Barber who have enabled us to continue to worship each Sunday. Thank you both for your time and spiritual guidance. On July 17th, Daryl Herrmann led us in Morning Prayer and our organist, Bea Bastyr was able to take a few days off.

I thought this might be a good time to talk about the liturgical calendar. Some of you read the lessons and are very familiar with the inner workings of the worship service, but some of you might like some information on the topic. First, the word liturgical or liturgy refers to the rituals around what we do each Sunday. The liturgical calendar is the method we use to determine what four scripture readings are read: the Old Testament, New Testament, Psalms, and the Gospel. The readings are read in a three year cycle A,B,C and when we are through the cycle, most of the Bible will have been read. We are currently in year C, but on November 27th we start the cycle over with year A.

The calendar also tells us what colors to use on the altar and what colors the priest wears. Did you know that you can walk into any Christian church on any given Sunday and you will likely hear the same readings from the Bible? That's because the liturgical calendar is based on the Roman Catholic lectionary calendar and most Christian denominations follow that calendar.

Next time we will talk about the controversial BCP!!

I would like to take this opportunity to address you about something important for Holy Trinity. Many of you are not aware, but we have had for a few years now, the right of first refusal for the house and property adjacent to the church, and next to the Quinn house behind us. We just recently learned that the house is coming up for sale, and the vestry has decided we should look into the prospect of purchasing this property. Needless to say, the timing of this could certainly be better, but it is what it is. We have asked Jeff Nagorski to look into this for us, and he very graciously accepted, and is more than willing to help out in this matter. While **nothing** is finalized yet, we have asked Jeff to explore the options of purchasing this piece of property. There are a few hurdles we must overcome in this quest, (getting approval from ECMN for instance), but I would like to stress that **NO pledges or donations** would be used to acquire this property. All the funds would come from securing a loan, renting out the property, and possibly some funds from the Quinn house, which is kept in a separate account. We feel if this is done right, it could be a real asset to Holy Trinity, as the Quinn house has been. Right now, we are in the exploratory stage only, and will keep you updated as we progress.

As for the Quinn house, the vestry approved a plan for all new windows for the Quinn house, as they are the original windows, and are sorely needed. They are literally falling apart. They should be installed in Sept. or Oct. We have also agreed to a new lease with our tenant, for another two years.

We have successfully switched from Facebook to YouTube for Sunday services. We have received some positive feedback, some negative, but most of you seem to think it is better. Emily and I went to the Episcopal church in Anoka for a lesson in how they do things, and it was very productive. We learned a lot from going there, and they were very helpful to us.

Jottings from your Treasurer

As we moved through the Summer and life in transition, the Vestry and your Treasurer have been at work. One of the things your Treasurer has been working on is aligning the church financial policies and guidelines with the Canons of ECUSA and ECMN as well as the current Manual for Church Business Affairs, an invigorating read. Please note that the word Canon as used here relates to the working "rules" of the church and not a person. Canons of ECUSA are generally updated every time General Convention meets with potential for updates that the national lawyers see fit in between sessions. Canons of the ECMN are updated as appropriate to comply with the national Canons, changes in law, or changes in direction. These are approved at the diocesan convention. Both sets of Canons are available on-line for download if this is of interest to you as is the Manual mentioned.

With this in mind, the Vestry has approved two sets of Financial Policies and Guidelines for Holy Trinity. One covers four types of "demand" or checking/savings accounts and the other covers a special type of checking account known as the Discretionary Account. It has been suggested that I explain these accounts and the terms surrounding them.

Our primary operating account is often known as a "general checking account". This and the other accounts mentioned today are all held with the Bank of Elk River. General Checking is where we retain the funds for daily operation of the church. It is an interest-bearing checking account.

A second account is the "Rental/Quinn House Account". This is where the funds for operating our rental property reside. Related to that is a third account, a Rental Savings Account. This is where the funds received as deposits are retained, per Minnesota law.

A fourth type of account is one designated for fund raising and groups within the church. Examples would be Women's or Men's Group or one for a special purpose such as a Youth Group trip.

The other policy is solely related to the special type of checking known as Discretionary. This account has very specific rules in the ECMN Canons. It is an account established for use by the Rector/Priest in Charge within a Faith Community. Holy Trinity has always set aside an amount annually to add to that account. It turns out the Canons now have the first Sunday "loose plate" (non-Pledge) offering identified as contributions to that account. That is why you are seeing notes in the bulletin about that. Beyond that, anyone may donate at any time to the "Discretionary Account". A typical time for those donations is at Christmas or at the celebration of a new Ministry, This account is truly a "guarded" account. With Father Rob's departure, the account is now under the management of our Vestry member for Pastoral Care. The only people who see the transactions in this account are those managing it: Pastoral Care Vestry Member, a Priest under longer term contract with Holy Trinity, and the Treasurer and Bookkeeper. The account is meant to be for confidential use in helping those within the Parish and the broader community as appropriate with immediate, short-term needs.

The biggest item of note in the Discretionary Account Policy and Guidelines is that we added our Pastoral Care Vestry member, Lyla Aaland, to the account. The intent is to keep that person as the oversight person who will work with a new Priest to manage those funds.

Several items to call out in the broader set of Policies and Guidelines are:

- 1) On-going oversight and management of church funds (all funds retained in accounts tied to the tax id of the church) is the responsibility of the Treasurer with oversight by the Vestry, Wardens and Priest-in-charge.
- 2) Placing a July Vestry decision into policy, the only alcohol to be purchased using church managed funds is to be used for sacramental purposes.
- 3) The primary system of record for all church funds will be the HTEC copy of QuickBooks with our HTEC-ER Office Administrator functioning as the primary bookkeeper.
- 4) Each account has identified signatories, with most being the Senior and Junior Warden and the Treasurer. Group accounts will have two or more people over 18 as designated signatories along with the HTEC Treasurer.

Both policies are records of the church and available for review by simply contacting the HTEC Office with your request. As with any new policy or guideline, there are already proposals in the works to amend and refine them.

After all this stimulating information, here are the current financial results, as of July 31, 2022. Sadly, this is the first month our net income balance is negative by roughly \$1,000.

What is a Canon?

I was asked this during coffee hour one Sunday. My first question to the group was "Canon as in the books of the Bible, the underlying rules of the ECUSA and ECMN, or as in a person's title?".

The word means several things in the life of the church. The confusion is normal enough that one of our recent Bishops included a discussion of the term in a newsletter.

Canon as used in a title indicates the person is a senior leader on the

Bishop's staff or on the staff of a cathedral overseen by that Bishop. If used alone, the person is most likely not ordained. If used with the term Reverend, as in Rev. Canon, the person is also ordained as a deacon or Priest. With the reason for the question explained, the answer was "Canon Karen Olson is a senior, long serving leader on the Bishop's staff who has not been ordained to Holy Orders. That is why the service she will lead for us in September is morning prayer and not communion."
