## SR. WARDEN

#### DARYL HERRMANN

The last few months, my Newsletter articles have dealt with the steps Karen Olson recommended our Search Team follow to find a new priest. Let's pretend for a few minutes that we are fairly large business/company rather that an Episcopal church.

If we, as a business, knew we needed to replace an administrator within our company, we would begin by describing the vacant position, explaining the necessary duties, and setting the salary range. We would then advertise the position in appropriate media, gather applications, and begin interviewing. Next would follow offering someone a contract. Generally, right?

Not so with an Episcopal church. Yes, we would appoint a team and define all the necessary details. This is where things change. That information is sent to ECMN where it is disseminated within the ECMN area and possibly outside that area. ECMN would then collect responses and applications, and send appropriate ones back to the church. Think of this as early screening or sorting.

One major portion of ECMN's work is determining what dollars the church has that could sustain a new priest, full time, part time, and what % of time. The key word here is sustain. Simply put, that means we have money today to start employment and will continue to have the necessary funds to continue employment in the future.

Once we have completed the interview process with appropriate candidates, the church/Team does not "offer a candidate a contract." Instead, we issue a "call." This means that the church, the candidate and ECMN all acknowledge the presence of God in all our actions and decisions, and know that it is God who makes the final decision. After praying and discerning all information about the situation, a candidate "accepts the call." The church then, instead of offering a contract to the candidate, offers the candidate a "covenant" between ECMN, the church, the candidate and God. This covenant assures all of us of God's continuing presence and influence in our lives, in and out of church.

My request to you now is that you pray for your church, ECMN, the Search Team and candidates that we may find a suitable an appropriate candidate to call to Holy Trinity.

(Thanks to Rev. Kathleen Galvin for mentioning the last portions of this process and inspiring me to share this information with you.)

#### **JR. WARDEN**

Jeff Nagorski is progressing through paperwork for Holy Trinity to acquire the property next door; **nothing** is finalized yet. I would again like to stress that **NO pledges or donations** would be used to acquire this property. All the funds would come from securing a loan, renting out the property, and possibly some funds from the Quinn house, which is kept in a separate account. We feel if this is done right, it could be a real asset to Holy Trinity, as the Quinn house has been and will keep you updated as we progress.

As for the Quinn house, the vestry approved a plan for all new windows for the Quinn house, as they were the original windows, and were sorely needed. The windows were completed in mid October.

## TREASURER

#### Jottings from your Treasurer

We are entering the "home stretch" of our Financial Year with a lot going on.

Income is running slightly ahead of our budget in many areas, primarily due earlier payment of pledges with several people donating more than their pledge amount. Expenses for Church Operations are down due to the use of Supply Priests during our Search and Transition. If we continue through the end of the year in this manner, the Clergy Expenses lines will finish \$14,000 under budget which will help our bottom line which was estimated to close with a deficit over \$20,000.

As a Vestry, we are also changing our thinking on our rental property. Income and expenses for that investment are kept separately to allow us to focus on what it truly costs to operate the Church annually.

Below are the current operating income and expenses, as of September 30, 2022. As you can see, we are currently running a deficit of \$2,000.

#### **Report from your Convention Delegates**

As this is written, Joyce LeClaire and Mary Brugger are planning to attend the Diocesan Convention which will be held October 28<sup>th</sup> and 29<sup>th</sup> in Rochester. MN. In preparation, the pair met with other delegates from the West Metro Mission Area Group on September 29<sup>th</sup>, 2022.

We were joined in the Zoom session by representatives of the Central Metro Mission Area Group.

As with many of these sessions, the meeting opened with time spent Dwelling the Word. We were moved to small groups to get to know each other and to discuss the readings.

The primary presentation was designed to prepare us for what we would see and vote on at Convention. Canon Kelsey Schuster, Canon for Operations and Chief of Staff, walked us through the Elected Bodies for which we will vote, through Canonical Changes up for approval and the two resolutions currently on the Agenda for our consideration. One is titled" Expressing Support For Reproductive Rights and Bodily Autonomy". The second is titled: "Urging ECMN Faith Communities to Pray for Creation". We will also recognize Good Courage Farm as an Episcopal-Affiliated

Organization.

Most of the time in the meeting was spent reviewing the 2023 Financial Statement of Mission, also known as the Diocesan Budget. If anyone wishes to review the details of this, please let your delegates know.
