# LITURGY/WORSHIP

### Fellow Trinitarians:

It's March and this winter is not over; some of you are happy and some of you are patiently waiting for spring. Luckily Lent is here and it teaches us simple living and self-denial. I think the last weeks of winter is a perfect time for those two things. We will continue to have supply priests for each Sunday during lent. We are trading the consistency and predictability of a full-time priest for the opportunity to let others know what a warm and welcoming parish we are. We are also learning what we want and need in a new priest. Holy week begins April 2 with Palm Sunday. We will have service for both Maundy Thursday and Good Friday. Reverend Wanda Copeland will be back for Easter Sunday.

As your liturgical representative, I would like to tell you a little bit about *The Book of Common Prayer*. In previous times *The Book of Common Prayer* was used by every parishioner to guide them through Sunday service.. Many of our parishioners can remember using the red book with the cross on the cover before the paper bulletins we use today. We no longer have the BCP in our hands; however, in the Sunday bulletin, we use liturgy taken from the BCP. The Book Of Common Prayer is our book, those of us who are Anglican Communicants. It was composed by the archbishop of Canterbury in 1549 and has been revised many times and continues to be updated.

The BCP was written to differentiate the Anglican liturgy from the Roman Catholic. The current rendition of the BCP is often described as a middle ground between Roman Catholicism and Protestantism. As modern parishioners know, it is often the Anglican (Episcopal) church that is chosen as a good compromise when the one party in a marriage is Roman Catholic and the other Protestant. Whether it's preparing for baptisms, weddings, funerals, special services like Easter or just Sunday service, the Book of Common Prayer is our resource.

### USHER RESPONSIBILITIES

Being an Usher may be more important than you think!

You are one of the first faces a new-comer encounters coming through the front door. Greeting everyone with a simple "Good morning!" and a smile goes a long way in making all feel welcomed.

### **Usher duties include:**

- 1. Placing the Welcome banner outside in front of the church and bringing it in after the service.
- 2. Unlock the front door before the service and lock it following the service.
- 3. Handing everyone a bulletin when they enter the church.
- 4. If needed, assist members/visitors in finding a place to sit.
- 5. In case of a large event, ushers can go to the front and excuse pews to go up for communion. This helps with those unfamiliar to our customs.
- 6. Ring the church bell before the service begins (9:55 a.m. 10:00 a.m.) Fun fact; usually ushers ring the bell nine (9) times!
- 7. Ask two (2) individuals to carry up the gifts of Bread, Water and Wine. This can be done before church begins or during sharing of the Peace. The gifts are carried up to the altar after the Peace is shared.
- 8. Collect the Offering using the offertory plates during the Offertory hymn.
- 9. Bring up the Offering at the Doxology and hand it to the Acolyte.
- 10. Place the kneeler in the center area in front of the pews for Communion.
- 11. Be the last person to take Communion and move the kneeler back in its place.
- 12. After the service pick up any leftover bulletins and any other paper inserts and place in recycling.
- 13. Assist in taking the garbage and recycling to the curb.
- 14. Count all people in the Sanctuary, Parish Hall, Nursery and fill out attendance ticket (found on table in the entry). After the service place the ticket on the record book in the Sacristy.

Most importantly, welcome people with a smile, a "good morning", and a bulletin. We are always looking for more volunteers; both women and men. A training session will be provided – only takes about 30 minutes to walk through the duties.
